League of Oregon Cities Bulletin

[Read the most recent LOC Bulletin here.](#) Of note,

- The application period is now open for the Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Development's 2025-2027 Housing Planning Assistance program. This funding opportunity supports cities, counties, and federally recognized Tribal governments in Oregon with planning efforts that increase housing production, affordability, and choice. The application window runs through August 4.



- LOC's SDC survey is due June 27. The data collected allows cities to compare rates of system development charges and provides information about the decisions other cities make when adopting these fees. By completing the survey, it will help the LOC advocate to keep SDC discussions and decisions at the local level.
 - Portland State University's Population Research Center will begin collecting housing unit and population information for Oregon's annual population estimates next month. The PRC will be contacting city representatives the week of July 7.

Bend 2025 Point-in-Time Count

The **Central Oregon Homeless Leadership Coalition** has released updated information specific to **Bend's 2025 PIT Count**. Of note:

- The count captured 1101 individuals who were experiencing homelessness in Bend, up from 974 in 2024.
 - The increase of 27 individuals reflects improved engagement and service provider relationships rather than necessarily new arrivals or entry into homelessness. Enhanced outreach and shelter capacity from the Governor's Executive Order contributed to more accurate counting.
 - Local Impact: Old Mill Apartments (75 units) opened in January 2025 and Cleveland Commons (33 units) permanent supportive housing (PSH) opened in February 2025, providing the first subsidized supportive housing and brick-and-mortar PSH in Central Oregon, respectively. These residents will not appear in future counts.

S&P Global Ratings Report

S&P released their **ratings report** related to the 2020 Sewer Revenue Bonds and has affirmed the City's "AA" rating.

Although S&P didn't upgrade the sewer bonds "AA" rating – citing broad concerns about the U.S. economy – they have assigned a positive outlook to the credit, signaling the potential for an upgrade in the next year or two.

City of Bend Receives Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting from the Government Finance Officers Association

For the 32nd consecutive year, the City of Bend has received the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting from the GFOA, the highest form of recognition in governmental accounting and financial reporting. This year, the City was recognized for its annual comprehensive financial report for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2024.

This award represents hundreds of hours worked by the City's Finance Team. The continued success of receiving this acknowledgement of our high-quality work is very much appreciated.

- The Bear Creek/Purcell Roundabout project started June 2. Closure of the Bear Creek/Purcell Intersection is in place.
